By simplifying the format it is possible to maintain the original style of the printed proceedings for output in PDF. A single font type (Times New Roman, 12 point, black at single line spacing) for the whole proceedings provides clarity of presentation. To improve visual presentation alternative font sizes are used for the title (18 point bold, left alignment), author list (12 point bold, all capitals, presenting author underlined, left alignment), address (12 point, left alignment) and abstract text (12 point, left alignment). All margins are the same (2.5 cm). The abstract should contain the aims, key results and quote actual figures (e.g. levels of treatments, yields, other responses, always in standard international units); all without subheadings and in a single paragraph. Do not include Tables, Figures or References. Authors are strongly encouraged to have co-authors and/or colleagues proof-read the abstract before submission, as poorly written abstracts will not be accepted. A limit of 400 words (not including title, authors or addresses) will keep abstracts concise and to the point.

Save your abstract as in “rich text format” using your surname and first initial as follows: for a paper by Sandra Sand, SANDS_final.rtf.

Please indicate your preferred presentation style:

- Oral presentation only
- Poster presentation only
- Oral or poster presentation

Only one oral presentation abstract and one poster presentation abstract can be submitted per first author.
