Professor Collard is with the School of Indigenous Studies at the University of Western Australia. His research has broadened the understanding of the many unique characteristics of Australia's Aboriginal people and contributed to improving the appreciation of Aboriginal culture and heritage of the Southwest of Australia. He is a Whadjuk Nyungar elder and a respected Traditional Owner of the Perth Metropolitan area and surrounding lands, rivers, swamps ocean and it's culture.
